- Comply with requirements of the Health & Safety at Work Act 1974 and to any other applicable legislation or requirements and all duties and obligations imposed by these Acts and Regulations affecting the activities of Newmor Wallcoverings.
- Providing a positive safety culture in which every employee, contractor and visitor feels free to speak up about non-conformances, undesirable or unsafe situations or any other occupational health & safety issue.
- Having a risk-based process in place for the identification, classification, prioritising and controlling of hazards and risks.
- Ensure adequate budgetary provision and resources in time, materials and management in order to achieve our occupational health & safety objectives, as well as current applicable legislation.
- Arrangement shall be made for the periodic survey of all working practices. Recommendations for improvements and any corrective actions will be implemented so as far as is reasonably practicable.
- Provide all employees, contractors and visitors with relevant information, operation controls and regular training on occupational health & safety requirements to enable them to conduct their activities safely.
- Regularly review the safety training needs of our employees and ensure that training is maintained.
- Ensure only competent subcontractors a re approved and used for works undertaken.
- Establish effective arrangements for employer / employee consultation and participation with workers or their elected representatives on matters concerning occupational health & safety.
- Maintain measures designed to prevent accidents and cases of work-related ill health.
- Professional occupational medical advice shall be provided to all employees as necessary.
- Invest and learn from accidents and incidents, taking action to reduce and prevent future accidents and incidents.
- Ensure that this occupational health and safety policy is monitored and reviewed at least annually and make the
  policy available to all employees and interested parties.
